IOM ACCREDITATION

Accreditation usually refers to established regional accrediting organizations associated with conventional colleges and universities. Criteria for regional accreditation were established long before the concept of distance-learning education, and therefore accreditation for distance learning varies considerably. Our priority is to offer high-quality education in the field of natural medicine that is relevant, affordable, and biblically approved. Our objective is to apply for and seek the appropriate distance-learning accreditation that honors our unique mission and standards.

The International Institute of Original Medicine is accredited by the American Naturopathic Medical Accreditation Board (ANMAB), and the American Association of Drugless Practitioners (AADP), the two major accreditation boards for natural health distance-learning schools in the United States. As an ANMAB and/or AADP accredited school, IOM doctoral candidates are equipped and qualified to become Board Certified by the American Naturopathic Medical Certification Board (ANMCB) and American Association of Drugless Practitioners (AADP), respectively.

The American Naturopathic Medical Accreditation Board (ANMAB), formerly ANMCAB, was founded in 1978, and incorporated in Washington, D.C., This prestigious organization has recognized and met the need to promote and regulate naturopathic traditional and non-traditional education over a period of thirty-one years. Through the process of review ANMAB adopted criteria and procedures for evaluating institutions and its programs. This system of review has worked for determining the qualities of sound educational programs, and ethical business practices, in all areas of natural health care. The organization's Committee on Accreditation oversees all evaluations conducted by the investigative team, and grants final approval. ANMAB's website is at www.anmab.org.

The American Naturopathic Medical Certification Board (ANMCB) is a non-profit worldwide organization registered in Washington, DC, that administers certification for natural health care professionals. The American Association of Drugless Practitioners Certification and Accreditation Board provides full board professional accreditation and certification to both institutes of higher education and professional practitioners. The AADP website is www.aadp.net.

CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS

Certificate programs provide practical, focused knowledge in one aspect of natural health for self-application or for consultations with the public, clients, family, or friends. Certificate programs are offered to students who do not wish to pursue a degree or as a prerequisite to fulfill some of the requirements of an IOM degree program. For students who have been away from school for a while, we recommend (but do not require) that they take the one-credit course IOM 55 Strategies for Learning Success as a separate, individual course prior to beginning the Certificate Program of their choice. Much of the course work and credit hours completed during an IOM certificate program is applicable to an IOM degree program.

CERTIFIED NUTRITION COUNSELOR (CNC)

This Certificate Program covers the field of nutrition and diet. Conventional nutrition and the deficiencies of the standard American diet are compared to the benefits of naturopathic nutrition and the original diet. The IIOB Bachelor of Science in Original Medicine (BSOM) covers the last 2 years in which college students normally concentrate on their major area of study. Therefore, we prefer that students entering this degree program already have an Associate's Degree or a Bachelor's Degree to assure a general fund of knowledge. However, we welcome students with other types of relevant experiences and training as we do recognize the value of life experience and the general fund of knowledge gained in the workplace or in managing a home and family. All students must be able to use a computer to create documents and communicate via e-mail. Building on a previous college degree or life experience, this degree program then focuses on what would be the junior-level and senior-level courses with a major in Original Medicine.

DOCTOR OF NATUROPATHY IN ORIGINAL MEDICINE

90 CREDITS

The IOM Doctor of Naturopathy in Original Medicine (DNOM) degree program is designed to be one of the most diversified programs available in the field of natural healing in the 21st century. We provide these offerings in a dynamic, relevant, and efficient educational delivery system designed to meet the diversified needs of our valued, self-directed, mature students.

The student will be equipped and empowered with Biblically-based natural health information with clear, comprehensive, and practical health information in an easy-to-absorb and efficient format that will meet a broad range of personal and professional health goals.

The IOM Admissions Committee will decide if credits transferred from another school meet the requirements of IOM or if there are additional IOM Bachelor-level or Master-level courses that need to be taken before beginning the Doctoral-level courses.

A total of **59 core requirement credits** form the foundational basis of the IOM doctoral program, and the student must choose a **minimum of 31 elective credits** for a total of **90 credits**. This allows our valued students to personalize their curriculum to meet a wide range of personal and professional endeavors. IIOM 75 Medical Missionary Manual**2 credits**

IOM 38 Chemistry of Essential Oils

3 credits

An excellent scientific, biblically-based coverage of the chemistry and efficacy of essential oils.

Courses in Alternative Medicine

IOM 40 Acupressure

1 credit

This course covers the topic of acupressure and deep finger pressure over acupuncture points.

IOM 41 Elements of Massage Therapy

3 credits

This course is a case study or project, selected by the student, that pertains to nutrition and diet.

Textbook: None required.

IIOM 81 Case Study or Project (CHOM) 2 credits

This course is a case study or project, selected by the student, that pertains to the principles and practice of herbs and original medicine.

Textbook: None required.

IOM 82 Case Study or Project (CMM)

2 credits

This course is a case study or project, selected by the student, that pertains to the medical missionary principles and practice.

Textbook: None required.

IOM 89 Case Study of Project (BSOM)

This course is a case study or project, selected by the student that pertains to nutrition and diet.

IOM 90 Master's Thesis

10 credits

This course involves researching and writing a master's thesis on a specific topic of interest in original medicine.

Textbook: None required.

IOM 91 Doctoral Dissertation

15 credits

This course involves researching and writing a doctoral dissertation that includes original research.

Textbook: None Required.

ENROLLMENT AND ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

All students must enroll as students of the International Institute of Original Medicine to qualify for credits toward certification and degree requirements and for continuing education. There is a one-time, nonrefundable \$40 registration processing fee that is due at the time of submission of an IOM Application for Enrollment Form to complete the initial enrollment in IOM in any individual course, certificate program, degree program, or practicum.

The basic requirements for successful completion of our programs are common sense, an open mind, an open heart, and a personal desire to understand and apply biblically based natural health principles and concepts. However, to properly understand college-level materials in our programs, a high school diploma, equivalency, or similar learning experiences may be helpful. Fluency in English writing and comprehension is necessary. All students must be able to use a computer to create documents and communicate via e-mail.

The IOM Bachelor's Degree covers the last 2 years in which students concentrate on their major area of study. Therefore, we prefer that students entering this degree program already have an Associate's Degree or a Bachelor's Degree to assure a general fund of knowledge. However, we welcome students with other types of relevant experiences and training as we do recognize the value of life experience and the general fund of knowledge gained in the workplace or in managing a home and family.

Students entering the Master's Degree program must already have a Bachelor's Degree in Original Medicine from IOM, another naturopathic school, or courses, relevant experiences, or training. The IOM Admissions Committee will decide if credits from another school meet the requirements of IOM or if there are additional IOM Bachelor's level courses that need to be taken before beginning the Master's level courses.

Students entering directly into the Doctoral degree program must already have a Master's Degree in Original Medicine from IOM, a Master's Degree from another naturopathic school, or a formal medical degree (M.D., D.C., D.D.S., etc.). The IOM Admissions Committee will decide if credits transferred from another school meet the requirements of IOM or if there are additional IOM Bachelor's or Master's level courses that need to be taken before beginning the Doctoral level courses.

HOW TO ENROLL

The enrollment procedure is very simple. Prospective students must complete the IOM Application for Enrollment Form found online or at www.iiomonline.com or at the end of this catalog. If you have any questions about enrollment, you may call our office at 410-884-9319, and we will personally assist you to ensure a productive and efficient enrollment experience. At the time of enrollment, you will select an educational offering (certificate program, a degree program, or an individual course) and you will submit the nonrefundable IOM registration fee of \$40 plus the payment option you have chosen for the program or course you select.

TUITION FEES

There is a personalized evaluation of formal or informal credits and life experience as students apply for admission to IOM. There is a one-time, non-refundable application/registration fee of \$40.00.

Tuition fees include course syllabi, study guides, and final examinations for each course. Students are responsible for purchasing textbooks, as required for most courses. The tuition fees for the certificate programs already include the cost of 3 course textbooks that are provided to the student by e-mail in a PDF e-textbook format. Tuition fees are subject to change without notice.

Course credits earned in certificate programs can be applied to degree programs. The following is a summary of the IOM tuition fees and credits for our standard offerings.

TUITION PAYMENT

PRIOR STUDY CREDITS

IOM may choose to honor credits from other institutions (documented by a transcript from the institution), as well as formal and informal professional experiences, life experiences, or disciplined personal study programs (documented by proof of attendance or a description of activities including dates and total number of hours, with a signed statement from the student). Seminars, short courses, and one-day programs may be considered if their content material is relevant. All information will be reviewed by our Admissions Committee for relevance and credit-worthiness. We believe that this is consistent with a fair and balanced approach that meets the needs of all our valued students as well as the educational requirements of IOM.

COURSEWORK

All certificate and degree programs are divided into courses. Course materials are designed to help students learn effectively and at an optimum pace. We want our students to have a productive learning experience in addition to the personal/professional commitments in their lives. Some courses require exploration of critical or new areas of health and natural medicine via outside readings or Internet research. Other courses require students to assess their own lifestyle and make changes for the better. A final examination is at the end of each course. Each course must be completed with a grade of 95 percent or better in order to receive a final certificate or degree. We encourage students to retain all graded assignments until the completion of your program.

GRADING

All IOM courses and the final examination are to be submitted via email with the assigned work as an attachment to the e-mail. Assignments must be completed satisfactorily, and the final examination must receive a final grade of 95 percent or above, which constitutes satisfactory completion of that assignment. A grade below 85 percent requires a personal telephone interview between the student and the instructor of the course and a mandatory retest of that course material. Any retest will be given a pass or fail only.

Proficiency will be based on the student's diligence in learning the course material and the amount of personal additional study and experience he/she pursues in a chosen area of personal or professional interest.

ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

Ethical values and choices are at the heart of the study of naturopathy and our biblically based approach to nutrition and health. Each student is expected to maintain academic integrity and exhibit academic honesty while enrolled in IOM courses. This includes respecting IOM policies; making true and accurate statements on the IOM Admissions Form; refraining from cheating on assignments and final examinations; and not plagiarizing the work of other students or published documents. Students in violation of this academic integrity policy will be subject to academic discipline that can include expulsion from IOM without tuition refund.

ACADEMIC PROGRESS

As soon as you enroll, IOM will send you the list of required textbooks for your course, certificate program, or degree program, as well as the IOM Getting Started Kit. If you are enrolled in a certificate or degree program, subsequent courses will follow thereafter.

Students are invited and encouraged to dialogue with their instructors and with IOM about their academic progress. If you feel confused, anxious, not “on track,” or are concerned about anything about the course, immediately contact your instructor or IOM by e-mail or telephone. Believe it or not, every student feels that way from time to time! It’s a normal response to the stress of learning something new!

CERTIFICATE, DEGREE, AND COURSE TRANSCRIPTS

At the completion of all academic and financial requirements, certificate or degree students will receive an official diploma that can be framed along with a detailed transcript of all courses completed.

Students who complete the academic and financial requirements for an individual course will receive a transcript listing that course.

Additional copies of a student’s transcript may be requested for \$10 each for an electronic copy.

TIME LIMIT FOR COMPLETION OF COURSES OR PROGRAMS

The student is required to finish at least one individual course in a six-month period. Each certification program must be completed in its entirety within three years. Each degree program must be completed in its entirety within five years. Exceptions for exceptional circumstances will be considered by the IOM Admissions Committee on a case-by-case basis, with written explanation.

WITHDRAWAL FROM COURSES OR PROGRAMS

We realize that due to unexpected life circumstances students may have to withdraw from an individual course or from a certificate or degree program. All withdrawals must be requested in writing. No tuition refunds are given after 10 days following enrollment.
